



What This Is About

Congress recently enacted a new federal tax credit that makes billions of dollars available to support K-12 education in participating states. Here is the idea in brief.

The opportunity

- A new federal tax credit program supports K-12 education.
- It makes billions of dollars available in participating states.

The challenge

- The funds cannot go to schools directly.
- The process is complicated to administer and keep compliant.

How the Foundation helps

- Your students benefit, without your school carrying the administrative or compliance burden.
- The support does not come from somewhere new: it comes from the people already around your school.
- No cost to your school, and no net cost to most participants.

THE IDEA IN ONE LINE

The community already around your school funds your students, and the Foundation handles everything in between.

This information sheet simplifies a federal tax program (the federal scholarship tax credit, Section 25F) and is not tax advice; everyone's situation is different. "No net cost" assumes at least \$1,700 in federal income tax liability; unused credit can carry forward up to five years. The K-12 Scholarship Foundation's federal 501(c)(3) status and Scholarship Granting Organization listing are pending, and the credit applies in participating states.
